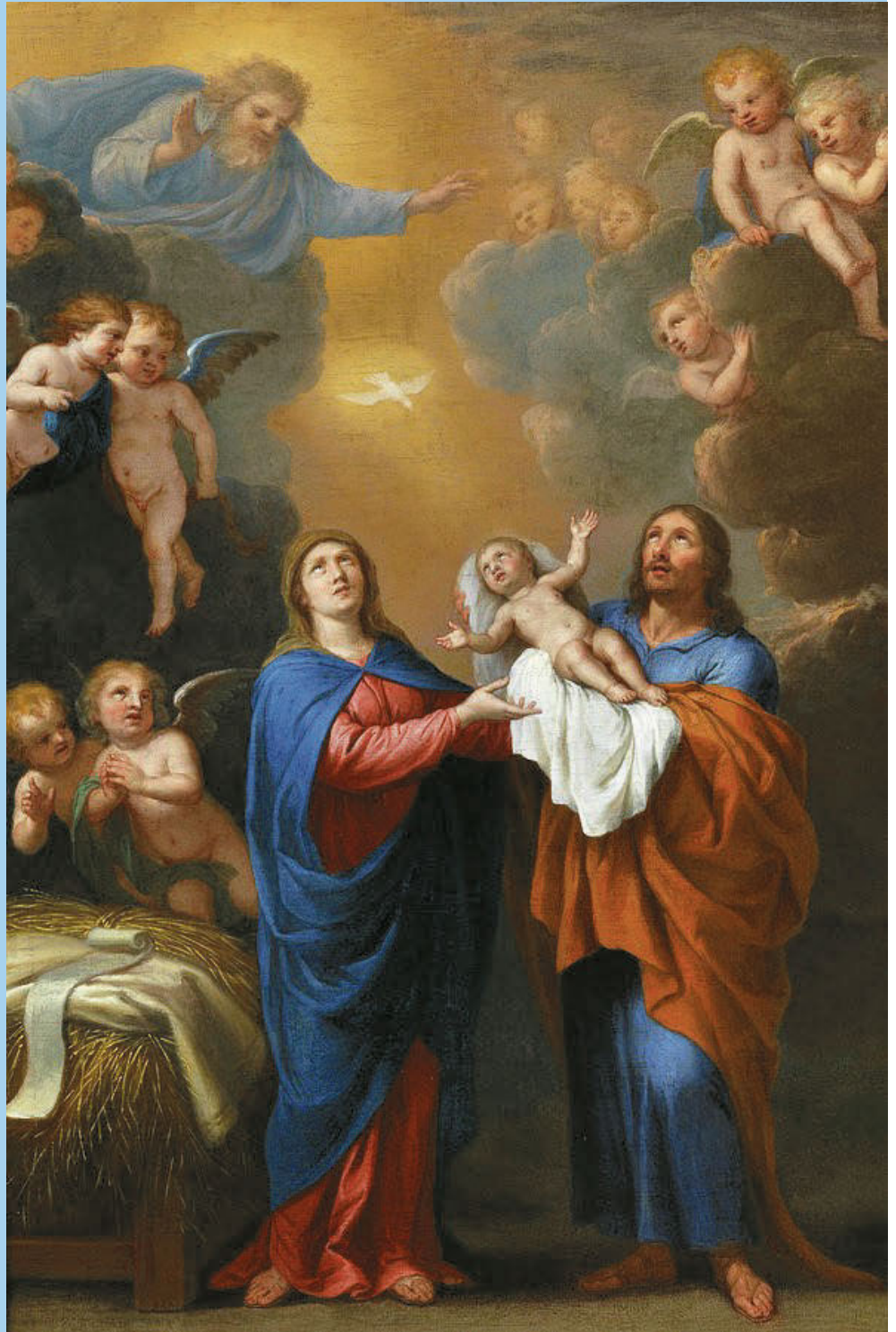

Dear Parishioners,

I pray that this Christmas season is filled with peace and joy for you and your family. It is important to remember Christmas is not a day—but a season of joy. It is a time we as Christians focus on the gift of a God who became flesh and dwelt among us. He reveals Himself in simplicity and humility. This is how God acts and exposes His Divine Love. It is true, beautiful and good....human hearts are drawn to this mystery in the infant Jesus and the Holy Family.

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Holy Family. We look to Joseph, Mary and Jesus for strength and grace. I often hear people say, “Well Father, we aren’t a perfect family.” That is true...no family is perfect, but with God’s grace we can be HOLY. This is the mystery of God’s love revealed in the Nativity, that even in imperfect situations, if we are open to His Divine Will, we can be holy. With Jesus and His grace we can be holy. 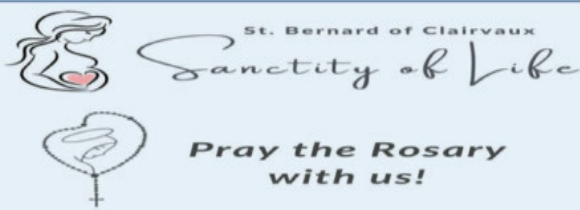


Women's Bible Study

Everyday Stewardship

I have heard people say, “You don’t get to choose your family!” I believe that to be only partially true. I did not choose my father and mother, but my family is greater than my family tree of ancestors. My family includes those who have been there when both my father and mother passed away. My family includes those who came to see my newborn children in the hospital. My family includes those who celebrated with me my greatest triumphs and consoled me in my greatest times of trial. Each and every one of them I have chosen to be a part of my family.

Most of the time we talk about stewardship in terms of time, talent, and treasure. We quantify the size of our gifts, seeing them as things that have a finite value. Live The 12 Days, For Bethlehem's Sake



My name is John Even, and I am an estate planning and probate attorney here in Phoenix and one of the supporters of your Parish Magazine. For this month's article, I would like to introduce you to my wife, Rebecca and her very important work benefiting Holy Family Hospital in Bethlehem, a primary work of the Order of Malta. Holy Family Hospital is a maternity hospital that serves all people and is located just 1,500 steps from the birthplace of Jesus, the Prince of Peace.

In 2011, our parish priest sent us a letter stating that the 12 Days of Christmas song may be a 17th century Irish Catholic code instead of an 18th century English children's nursery rhyme. Intrigued, my Irish wife set out to learn more.

Later, Rebecca interviewed Father Stockert, the Byzantine priest who, while researching his doctoral thesis at Georgetown, found letters dated in the late 1600's from a Jesuit in Dublin, Ireland to a Jesuit in Douay, France explaining the origins of the song. Based on her research, Rebecca and I changed the way we celebrate Christmas as a family, and it has been a blessing! Rebecca went on to create tools for families to **Live The Twelve Days** by creating a song on iTunes, a book on Amazon, and an ornament kit on Etsy.

Twelve years later, when making giving tree ornaments to help support Holy Family Hospital, Rebecca was inspired to reignite the challenge for families to **Live The Twelve Days** and to raise money for Holy Family Hospital in Bethlehem at the same time. Rebecca enthusiastically said "If we donate 33% of each \$37.00 digital bundle, all we need is 82,000 families from across the United States to raise \$1 million for Holy Family Hospital. Let's do it!"

Any Mass celebrated on December 23-24 **concluded before 4:00pm on December 24 fulfills the obligation for the 4th Sunday of Advent.**

Any Mass celebrated on December 24 after 4:00 pm **must be a Christmas Mass and fulfills the obligation to attend Mass on Christmas.**

This year, New Year's Day (The Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God) falls on Monday. Though it remains a Holy Day, there is no obligation for the faithful to attend Mass on that day.

Mass for the Feast of the Holy Family, January 1st, 2024, will be at 9:00 am.
