## LENTEN DISCIPLINES OF FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.

## A MESSAGE FROM FR. FRED



Dear Parishioners,

We have begun our journey of Lent 2024 with the focus of *Renew us and Save us, O'Lord*. A brother priest, Father Herb Hauck, who has since passed away once shared this about the season of Lent:

*Lent leads us along a process whereby we gain growth in virtue. We use traditional forms of penance: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Why? Because they work! They are truly time-tested.*

*Lent is not for the faint of heart or for those who seek a quick fix. Lent can be tedious. Still, no more tedious than so many other life experiences which likewise have a positive goal, a step-by-step process to measure achievement, and a need for appropriate motivation.*

*The goal of Lent is offered in the forceful call to repentance of Ash Wednesday. We are challenged to gather the people and proclaim a fast. We are reminded that the Lord is concerned and takes pity on His people. We are directed to begin, to begin in hope, to begin with other Christians to build further on the sureness of belief that our God gives salvation.*

*The process of Lent continues day-by-day until we arrive at the focal celebration of the Triduum. In the gift and beauty of liturgical prayer at Mass, we are guided each day to consider our personal need for healing, to accept the abundance of God's blessing, to see clearly that without God's assistance our efforts are useless and in vain. But the message of hope remains powerfully strong.*

*The motivation for a "good Lent" must be the acceptance of a personal need for change.*

*"As the sands in the hour glass, so the days of our lives," unless we take care, take responsibility, take charge.*

*What a trip we are invited to make. A journey with the Lord.*

*A journey with God's people. A journey of blessing and grace!*

So it is that we begin our Lenten journey – with a desire to be renewed and saved. In a particular way we as a parish will focus on the gift of the Eucharist this Lent and Easter. Forming a deeper relationship with our Eucharist Lord through our attentiveness, prayer and study. The great mystery of the Mass and Eucharist is at the very center of God's loving saving grace for each one of us.

I encourage each individual and family to make a plan and commitment in some way to grow deeper in our prayer life at home and also here in the community. God creates us to be in communion and union with Him and one another. It is by intentionally giving Him time and attention with an open heart and mind that we are strengthened in faith.

Lent is a journey with the Lord and one another to deepen our faith and trust in his saving Love. Let us keep one another in prayer. Let us stay focused on our Eucharistic Lord and the mystery of the Mass celebrated and offered to a God who is always waiting for his people in Love.

## We Sang For The Pope in Rome



Singers from Pueri Cantores St. Bernard of Clairvaux (children's choir) and their families traveled to Rome over Christmas break to participate in the 44th Pueri Cantores International Congress. There we joined over 4000 young singers from around the world to sing at concerts, rehearsals and Masses. The week concluded on January 1, 2024 at St. Peter's Basilica when we attended and sang for Mass (Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary). Everyone had to get up early Jan. 1 so that we could get in line for St. Peter's. Our bus left at 6am, as security was very tight to get into the Basilica. Everyone was tired after a busy week but very excited to sing at the Papal Mass! We got seats close to the aisle so that we could see the Holy Father as he processed in. We waited for over an hour for the 10am Mass to start, but everyone's energy level was high, and our children met some other singers from Germany as we waited. (They compared video game habits.)

After the Mass, Pope Francis came down the aisle in his wheelchair and everyone was able to get great videos and pictures of him. The entire experience was one that none of us will ever forget. We hope you've enjoyed our little "journey" through these bulletin articles. We plan to attend again in 4 or 5 years, so parents - get those kids singing in the choir for next time! God bless-Kent

## Important Parish Announcement

St. Bernard's has acquired Two Automated  
External Defibrillators (AED) for the Church  
and the Parish Hall

It is not unusual for someone to experience a  
medical event at Church. This may just be fainting  
from dehydration, but it could also be something  
very serious, even life threatening, like a heart  
attack or a critical heart rhythm condition. One of  
these heart rhythm conditions is Ventricular  
Fibrillation (VF) which, if not treated within a few  
minutes, will cause death. Calling 911 is an  
important response to a medical emergency, but it  
likely takes 5 minutes or longer for paramedics to  
arrive. If the medical problem is VF, that is too  
long. CPR can help some acute heart events, but it  
will not fix VF. VF can be treated successfully with  
a procedure called defibrillation, and an Automated  
External Defibrillator (AED) is one way to accomplish  
this. AED's are compact pieces of equipment and  
have been available since 1999. AED's are found in  
many public places and are usually mounted on a  
wall in an easily visible and accessible area. AED's  
have saved lives. As the name indicates, AED's are  
automated, meaning that they provide  
understandable verbal instructions on how to use  
them and what to do, even for people without  
formal medical training. Use of an AED can save a  
life and "buy" time until paramedics arrive.

The availability of an AED is a valuable addition for  
our Church and provides important, potentially  
life-saving help for our parishioners and visitors.  
With the substantial number of group events and  
meetings, a second AED in the Parish Social Hall is  
an added measure of safety to that location. Also,  
encouraging parishioners to take an in-person or  
online CPR course, would be beneficial and provides  
more comfort in managing a medical emergency  
before trained medical personnel arrive.

St. Bernard's will be conducting a CPR class,  
administered by the City of Scottsdale Fire  
Department, on Sunday February 25<sup>th</sup> at 12:30pm  
in the Parish Hall. Please contact Mary Ann Sarge,  
262-510-1673 or the Parish Office, 480-661-9843,  
to register. We need volunteers to be CPR certified  
in order to use the AED's, which are very user  
friendly, and very easy to administer.
