




A MESSAGE FROM FR. FRED



Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday is known as *Laetare* Sunday, which means rejoice! It helps us to remember we are half way through the season of Lent and the great feast of the Church, Easter is just three weeks away. The opening antiphon for the Mass proclaims, "Rejoice, Jerusalem and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast." Rejoice and be joyful in Lent may seem strange but we live with the great mystery that we stand today as a people saved by the Cross of Christ. This special time of Lent is meant to deepen our joy, peace and faith in the saving love of Jesus. While every Mass puts us at the foot of Calvary it also

puts at the foot of the empty tomb. So as a people of God we must not forget the love of both the cross and the empty tomb. For this we can rejoice even in Lent.

I was praying this week and was filled with gratitude. I was thinking that last year at this time I was having a different Lent. A more private Lent in which I journeyed in a more solitary manner as I began my sabbatical. I moved about to different places and traveled to the land of Jesus. It was a time of transition, refreshment and renewal. I was in several parishes and cities the entire time of Lent.

This year I am grateful to be with you on this journey – fellow pilgrims on a Eucharistic journey of renewal. It has been special to pray together at daily Mass, Adoration, Stations of the Cross and other devotions. Some of you have shared stories of how you have recognized the Lord's stirring grace in you in various ways. We have had joyful conversations during our community events. We are allowing God to touch our minds through reading, various classes and groups. We are indeed recognizing that God dwells with His people and saves us in the mystery of our Catholic Faith.


So we are halfway to Easter. The next few weeks get a bit more intense as we draw closer to "Jerusalem." Next week we enter into the Passiontide and the statues and the crucifix will be covered. It is a way of fasting from the visual images to prepare ourselves for the special days that lie ahead. Some families do the same in their homes – a wonderful way to carry this time of Lent into your daily life at home. A way to further enter into the season.

Remember it is never too late to start the journey – to be a pilgrim. God waits for us – just make time to show up at Adoration, Stations or our Parish Penance service. We will have priests from different parishes available on Monday, March 11th to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance. It is a time to open your humble heart to the Lord so that you might encounter His merciful heart that heals and fill us with grace. Confessions will begin at 6:00 pm in the Church. Remember, "Where sin increased, grace abounded all the more" (Romans 5:20). Let God shower His grace upon you through His Son in the Sacrament of Penance.

Let us continue to pray for one another as we journey now to the great celebration of our Catholic Faith. May we continue to exclaim, *Renew us and Save us, O' Lord*.



SPIRITUAL ADOPTION PROGRAM Second Month

KEEP PRAYING! Your spiritually adopted baby has completed his second month of life in the womb He is making rapid progress developing all his external and internal organs. During this second month, his baby teeth are forming and his fingers and toes are developing. Ears, nose, lips, and tongue can now be clearly seen. Even his brain waves can be recorded. The skeleton changes from cartilage to bone. The central nervous system is now functioning and so forty muscle sets begin their first exercises. By 8 weeks, all body systems are present and the baby is called a 'fetus', a Latin word meaning 'little one' or 'young one'. Ultrasound reveals that this little one can now spring and jump the first dance steps.



How to Make a Good Confession

Confession is not difficult, but it does require preparation. We should begin with prayer, placing ourselves in the presence of God, our loving Father. We seek healing and forgiveness through repentance and a resolve to sin no more. Then we review our lives since our last confession, searching our thoughts, words and actions for that which did not conform to God's command to love Him and one another through His laws and the laws of His Church. This is called an examination of conscience.

To make an examination of conscience:

- Begin with a prayer asking for God's help.
- Review your life with the help of some questions, which are based on the 10 Commandments (see below).
- Tell God how truly sorry you are for your sins.
- Make a firm resolution not to sin again.

Examination of Conscience

Ask God to help you make a good confession. In quiet reflection ask yourself: Since my last confession...

- Did I pray to God, daily and from my heart?
- Did I live and witness to my Catholic faith, joyfully & courageously? Did I take God's name in vain? Did I curse anyone or make false oaths? Did I engage in superstitious or occult practices?
- Did I attend and participate actively at Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation? Did I fast & abstain on prescribed days?
- Did I respect people in authority? My employer? Did I honor my parents?
- Was I violent or unnecessarily aggressive (e.g., physically, verbally, psychologically, etc.) with anyone?
- Was I prideful, stubborn, or rude with anyone? Did I hold a grudge?
- Did I abuse alcohol, prescription medications, or illegal drugs? Did I overindulge in food?
- Did I consent to, recommend, advise, or actively take part in an abortion? Did I use abortifacient drugs?
- Did I view pornography, entertain lustful thoughts, conversations or actions?
- Was I unloving to my spouse? Did I engage in adulterous activity (e.g., sexual, emotional, virtual, etc.)?
 Did I use contraceptives?
- Was I neglectful of the spiritual, intellectual, emotional, or physical needs of my spouse, children, or family?
- Did I steal or damage another's property? Was I honest and just in my business relations? Did I waste time at work?
- Did I contribute to the needs of the spiritually and materially poor with my time and resources?
- Did I engage in gossip? Did I lie? Did I speak poorly of others? Did I judge anyone unfairly?
- Did I envy anyone? Was I jealous of others or covet another's belongings?
