

A MESSAGE FROM FR. FRED



Dear Parishioners,

This is the last week of us reading the Bread of Life discourse from the 6th chapter of John. It has been a five week journey of reflecting, pondering and exploring the great gift of the Eucharist in our lives as Catholics. As a recap, the first week reminded us of God's <u>abundant</u> love bestowed on His people in the feeding of the great multitudes with just five loaves and two fish. God's love and grace is not stingy but overflowing when we trust in Him. The second week we were reminded of our <u>hunger</u> to be fed not just food for the belly but the deeper spiritual food of mercy, love, peace and joy. The third week we reflected on God <u>providing</u> for His people, not worldly things or an easy life, but rather what truly sustains us

— the life of Christ – His love, forgiveness and salvation. Last week Jesus invited us to eat His flesh and drink His blood, an invitation to be one with Him and His divine life. God's wisdom leads us to His <u>real presence</u> in the Eucharist and ultimately our call to be present to Him and one another in our daily lives.

This final week many of Jesus' disciples say, "This saying is hard, who can accept it?' to eat His body and drink His blood. Many left and returned to their former ways of life. Jesus asked the twelve if they too want to leave. Simon Peter responds, "To whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." Peter and the other apostles and disciples will face challenges. They will journey with the Lord and ultimately witness His suffering and death; be surprised by His resurrection. Then, empowered by the Holy Spirit, they began sharing His word and breaking the bread as a community. It was at His command to eat His body and drink His blood that sustained the Church as it was growing and continues to this day for all who wish to stay and follow Him. We have the words of eternal life and bread from heaven – the gift of the Eucharist. WE too, respond as individuals and a community in our commitment to the breaking of the bread – the Holy Eucharist. When we gather every Sunday for Mass, God provides in abundance — He feeds our deepest hunger and quenches our thirst, He is truly present body, blood, soul and divinity so we can be truly present to one another and to those in need. The real test of faith is how we

follow Him and celebrate His love in our daily lives.

While it is hard to believe, we do so in faith. Hard to believe God becomes man, hard to believe He cures lepers, hard to



believe He raises Lazarus from the dead, hard to believe He feeds the multitudes, hard to believe He walks on water and calms the sea. Hard to believe His great love for each and every one of us — we are His beloved. His love saves and changes our hearts. When we eat His body and drink His blood, we share in His divine and eternal life — His love.

May we find strength in our commitment to being Eucharistic people.

Registration for Faith Formation for all Kindergarten through Eighth Grade students is going well and classes are filling up quickly. You may now register in the parish office.

All Elementary classes, Kindergarten through the Eighth Grade, will be offered on Tuesday's or Thursday's after school and early evening. Classes will begin the week of September 9th.

Formal catechesis at St. Bernard's begins in Kindergarten. In this diocese preparation for the Sacrament of First Reconciliation takes place in Second Grade and Confirmation and First Eucharist in Third Grade. All children beyond the third grade who are in need of Confirmation should enroll in their grade level class for preparation.

Our "Heritage" classes are for children, Third through Eighth Grade, baptized or unbaptized, who have missed preparing for the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Confirmation and Eucharist at the younger ages. We also offer Liturgy of the Word at the 9am Mass on Sunday. There is no registration for this.

Thank you to all who have volunteered to be catechists this year, but we can use a few more adults. All training and materials will be provided for you and there are many grade levels to choose from. Please call me at 480-661-9843ex314 or email me at kstine@stboc.org if you are interested in sharing faith with God's children or for more information on all of our programs.

You will find a schedule of days and times of classes, a calendar for the year and more detailed information about Faith Formation for your children on our website at stboc.org however, for now you will need to come into the Parish Office to register your children.


We are now part of the Augustine Institutes FORMED subscription service, which is a collection of Catholic content and teachings that will help us on our faith journey as individuals and a community.



Fruits of the Holy Eucharist

1391 Holy Communion augments our union with Christ. The principal fruit of receiving the Eucharist in Holy Communion is an intimate union with Christ Jesus. Indeed, the Lord said: "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him." Life in Christ has its foundation in the Eucharistic banquet: "As the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so he who eats me will live because of me." 227

On the feasts of the Lord, when the faithful receive the Body of the Son, they proclaim to one another the Good News that the first fruits of life have been given, as when the angel said to Mary Magdalene, "Christ is risen!" Now too are life and resurrection conferred on whoever receives Christ.²²⁸

<u>1393</u> *Holy Communion separates us from sin.* The body of Christ we receive in Holy Communion is "given up for us," and the blood we drink "shed for the many for the forgiveness of sins." For this reason the Eucharist cannot unite us to Christ without at the same time cleansing us from past sins and preserving us from future sins:

For as often as we eat this bread and drink the cup, we proclaim the death of the Lord. If we proclaim the Lord's death, we proclaim the forgiveness of sins. If, as often as his blood is poured out, it is poured for the forgiveness of sins, I should always receive it, so that it may always forgive my sins. Because I always sin, I should always have a remedy.²³⁰

1394 As bodily nourishment restores lost strength, so the Eucharist strengthens our charity, which tends to be weakened in daily life; and this living charity *wipes away venial sins*.²³¹



1395 By the same charity that it enkindles in us, the **Eucharist** *preserves us from future mortal sins*. The more we share the life of Christ and progress in his friendship, the more difficult it is to break away from him by mortal sin. The Eucharist is not ordered to the forgiveness of mortal sins - that is proper to the sacrament of Reconciliation. The Eucharist is properly the sacrament of those who are in full communion with the Church.

1396 The unity of the Mystical Body: the Eucharist makes the Church. Those who receive the Eucharist are united more closely to Christ. Through it Christ unites them to all the faithful in one body - the Church. Communion renews, strengthens, and deepens this incorporation into the Church, already achieved by Baptism. In Baptism we have been called to form but one body. 233 The Eucharist fulfills this call: "The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ? Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread:"234

If you are the body and members of Christ, then it is your sacrament that is placed on the table of the Lord; it is your sacrament that you receive. To that which you are you respond "Amen" ("yes, it is true!") and by responding to it you assent to it. For you hear the words, "the Body of Christ" and respond

"Amen." Be then a member of the Body of Christ that your Amen may be true. 235

1397 *The Eucharist commits us to the poor.* To receive in truth the Body and Blood of Christ given up for us, we must recognize Christ in the poorest, his brethren:

You have tasted the Blood of the Lord, yet you do not recognize your brother,.... You dishonor this table when you do not judge worthy of sharing your food someone judged worthy to take part in this meal.... God freed you from all your sins and invited you here, but you have not become more merciful.²³⁶

1398 The Eucharist and the unity of Christians. Before the greatness of this mystery St. Augustine exclaims, "O sacrament of devotion! O sign of unity! O bond of charity!"237 The more painful the experience of the divisions in the Church which break the common participation in the table of the Lord, the more urgent are our prayers to the Lord that the time of complete unity among all who believe in him may return.
